BARAT-BURN SCHOLARSHIPS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Who is able to apply?

Both prospective boys and girls students can apply for these scholarships. No students currently enrolled in Barat-Burn for 2022 can apply for these scholarships. KRB retains the discretion to change the eligibility criteria any time.

2. Is there a School Acceptance Fee for the Scholarships?

Yes, it is \$4500.

3. Can students from the Early Learning Centre (Sophie's Cottage and Joigny) apply?

Yes.

3. My child is currently enrolled in the stand alone ELC and I have paid a \$750 Acceptance Fee, what do I have to pay for the School Acceptance Fee?

The School Acceptance Fee including for Scholarships is \$4500 so you would pay this amount minus the \$750 you have already paid.

4. My child is currently enrolled in the ELC and I have paid a \$4500 Acceptance Fee (the previous ELC Acceptance Fee), what do I have to pay for the School Acceptance Fee?

Then there will be no additional Acceptance Fee.

5. What does the Scholarship cover?

The Barat-Burn Scholarship provides for a 60% reduction in tuition fee only. The schools current Schedule of Fees contains information in relation to additional sundry costs that you are not included ie uniforms, camps etc. Further information can be found here.

6. Can students currently enrolled from Kindergarten to Year 6 apply?

No.

7. I have applied to have my child come to KRB – I wasn't sure if it would be right for them. But I am very interested in this scholarship – so can I apply? My child is not currently a student enrolled at KRB. 8. I have been offered a place for my child in Year 3 2023 and as yet haven't accepted. Can I apply for the scholarship?

Yes.

9. I have been offered a place for my child in Year 3 2023 and have accepted. Can I apply for the scholarship?

No.

10. How many of these scholarships are going to be offered?

30 over three years. KRB retains the discretion to increase or decrease the number of scholarships it offers.

11. If I get an offer for the scholarship, accept the offer and then decide that KRB is not the right school for my child, are there any additional fees for withdrawal?

You will have to pay an additional fee for the scholarship for the years your child will not be at KRB – this is what you agreed to when you signed up. For example, if your child is awarded a three-year scholarship which is accepted by you and you withdraw the acceptance, you will be required to pay an additional fee based on the three years your child has been enrolled.

12. But the problem is that my son/daughter has been offered a place in Year 5 at Cranbrook/ Loreto – if I don't take it they might miss out so I will then be paying an additional fee to KRB and school fees for Cranbrook/ Loreto? That's a problem?

Unfortunately - that is what you agreed to.

13. I have withdrawn my child from KRB and have enrolled them at another school. But I would love to apply for the Scholarship and would prefer they were at KRB – is that OK? My child is not an enrolled student?

There needs to be a period of 12 months between the time you withdraw your child from KRB, before you would be eligible to apply for this scholarship.
